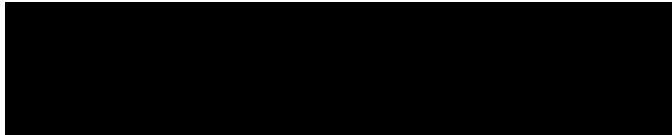

Thank you for your email of 4 February 2023, requesting updated information about Corrections' Patron Programme. Your request has been considered under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA).

You have requested:
